Matthew 6:9-13

What sorts of things does Jesus say we should ask for?

Give us our Daily Bread = \_\_\_\_\_

You and I cannot do anything without God

Forgive us our sins = \_\_\_\_\_

We all have a debt to God that we cannot pay

Deliver us from evil = \_\_\_\_\_

Asking for His guidance presupposes that you intend to follow His guidance

Not asking, \_\_\_\_\_\_ motives or that God

may want something \_\_\_\_\_ for you

could make God's answer to your prayer different from what you expected

KNEES AND FEET (Prayer and Action): Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you to a change of mind and action.

Serenity Prayer by Reinhold Niebuhr God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change; courage to change the things I can; and wisdom to know the difference. Living one day at a time; Enjoying one moment at a time; Accepting hardships as the pathway to peace; Taking, as He did, this sinful world as it is, not as I would have it; Trusting that He will make all things right if I surrender to His Will; That I may be reasonably happy in this life and supremely happy with Him Forever in the next.
